This handbook contains information about post-secondary institutions and financial aid. It attempts to educate graduates on the different Universities and Colleges they can apply for and gives tips on how to choose between schools.

Additionally, this handbook contains a list of bursaries, scholarships, and awards that are available to graduating Cariboo Adventist Academy students. There are opportunities available to those who wish to put in the effort. Many rewards acknowledge involvement within the school and community, so get involved!



Terms

General Institution Admission Requirements

Requirements that are mandatory for applicants. Each post-secondary's requirements vary.

Program Admission Requirements

In addition to the General Institution Admission Requirements, the program itself may have additional requirements.

Scholarships

Scholarships are traditionally based on academic achievement. However, scholarships are now given to students who have made achievements outside of academia. It is important to note that many scholarships require a copy of your academic transcripts.

Bursaries

Bursaries are typically awarded to students with financial need. Bursaries may have academic requirements but are predominantly focused on helping students who do not have the resources to pay for school. Bursaries usually require proof as to why you are in need of financial assistance.

Loans

Students loans contribute to a large portion of student financial aid. Students loans are provided by the government or a bank. Student loans, alongside the interest charged on the amount, are expected to be paid back after the students completes or leaves school.

Applying to Post-Secondary

STEP 1

WHAT IS OUT THERE?

Explore the different programs that are available. To narrow your search, focus on your interests: the subject you wish to study, your location, and the length of time.

STEP 2

WHAT FITS YOU?

Compare a few different post-secondary institutions and programs. Do they fit your career goals, the time you have, and how much you can afford? Keep in mind the transfer opportunities. Where you start may not be where you end up.

STEP 3

KNOW THE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

The General Institution Admission Requirements for each post-secondary school varies. Be sure you check the requirements and ensure you meet them.

STEP 4

THE PROGRAM

In addition to the General Institution Admission Requirements, the program itself may have additional requirements.

STEP 5

MONEY MATTERS

The cost of tuition and expenses vary from post-secondary to post-secondary. Compare tuition, living costs, transportation costs, as well as cost of books and supplies. Be sure to research scholarships and bursaries that are available to you.

STEP 6

DEADLINES

There are deadlines for applications and financial aid. Make note of them and be proactive.

STEP 7

EXPLORE THE CAMPUS AND SERVICES

Make a trip to the campus, find the map, and check out the housing options, clubs, sports, activities, and services that are available for you.

STEP 8

GET HELP

If you have questions or concerns, contact an academic advisor or the New Students or Student Recruitment office at the institution.

STEP 9

GET APPLY-READY

Preparing post-secondary admission application takes time and there are application fees. Make a check list of all the documents you need and ensure that all components of your application are sent in before the deadline.

Scholarships

APPLYING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

STEP 1

DO YOUR RESEARCH

Look for scholarships within your school, community, and specific post-secondary institution of choice.

STEP 2

READ THE CRITERIA

If you think you qualify for the scholarship, keep the application information. Do not stress over the ones you do not qualify for—use your time wisely!

STEP 3

SORT AND ORGANIZE

Gather and read all information for the scholarships you qualify for. Some require you to meet 100% of the criteria, while others have more flexibility. Focus your time on the ones that you believe you have the best chance of receiving.

STEP 4

MAKE A CALENDAR OF DEADLINES

Application deadlines will vary from scholarship to scholarship. Ensure your application is received at. Least four days before the deadline. Make sure *all* of the supporting documents are prepared in advance.

STEP 5

GATHER REFERENCE LETTERS

Contact your references and give them at least 4-6 weeks and plenty of time to customize their letters. Supply them with the details of the scholarships.

STEP 6

CREATE SCHOLARSHIP PORTFOLIO

Each application will ask for different supporting documents (resumes, personal statements, examples of work, achievements, essays, etc.). Create a portfolio. This will keep you organized and make these documents easily accessible.

STEP 7

TRANSCRIPTS

Most applications will require a copy of your transcripts from high school. Plan ahead—these take time!

STEP 8

PROOFREAD

Proofread your application carefully and ask someone to proofread it as well. Your application must look professional. Keep your application easy to read.

STEP 9

TRACK YOUR APPLICATIONS

Keep a copy of all applications you send and what days they were sent.

Scholarships

CANADA

Nation-Wide Scholarships & Bursaries

Canada student grant for full-time students: This program gives extra help to students from low and middle-income families.

Canada student grant for part-time students: This program provides extra help to low-income part-time students.

Canada student grant for part-time students with dependents: This program helps part-time students with dependents with the cost of education.

Canada student grant for services and equipment for students with permanent disabilities: This program helps part-time or full-time students with permanent disabilities pay for exceptional education related costs for services and equipment.

Canada student grant for students with dependents: This program helps full-time students with dependents with the cost of education.

Canada student grant for students with permanent disabilities: This program helps part-time or full-time students with permanent disabilities with the cost of education.

Schulich Leader Scholarships: Schulich Leader Scholarships are prestigious entrance scholarships awarded to high school graduates enrolling in Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics (STEM) programs at their 20 Canadian partner Universities.

BRITISH COLUMBIA

Provincial Scholarships & Bursaries

Assistance program for students with permanent disabilities: This program helps students with permanent disabilities pay for exceptional education-related services and adaptive equipment.

BC Achievement: BC Achievement Scholarships recognize the top 8,000 graduates in the province. The Ministry will determine recipients based on achievement in Grades 10, 11, and 12 courses.

B.C. access grant for deaf students: This grant helps deaf and hard of hearing students with the additional costs incurred while attending specialized post-secondary institutions where curriculum is delivered in American sign Language.

B.C. access grant for students with permanent disabilities: This program helps full-time students with a permanent disability with the cost of education by replacing approximately \$1,000 in B.C. student loan funding.

B.C. completion grant: Full-time students who successfully complete each year of their studies may have the B.C. portion of their Canada-B.C. integrated student loan debt reduced by the provincial government.

[BC Excellence](#): There are 55 BC Excellence Scholarships available to recognized well-rounded B.C. graduates.

[BC Tech Scholarships](#): Up to 3 grants for grade 12 graduates entering post-secondary.

[District/Authority](#): There are 5,000 District/Authority Scholarships distributed across school districts and independent school authorities. They recognize graduating B.C. students for excellence in their chosen area of interest or strength.

[Horatio Alger Association of Canada](#): Provides \$1.2 million annually in need-based scholarship support for deserving students in all Canada provinces and territories.

[Loran Scholars Foundation](#): Largest and most comprehensive four-year undergraduate award (valued at \$100,000) to young Canadians on the basis of character, service and the promise of leadership.

[Lieutenant Governor's Medal Program for Inclusion, Democracy and Reconciliation](#): Notices a student who has promoted diversity and inclusion.

[Northern Pathways to Medicine Bursary Program \(UNBC\)](#): University entrance award created by the Northern Medical Programs Trust.

[Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship](#): The Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship is awarded to 20 outstanding high school graduates who have demonstrated a commitment and aptitude for a career path in k-12 teaching.

[Skills for Hope Foundation Scholarships](#): For students who demonstrate involvement with community service or volunteerism and must demonstrate the ability to overcome challenges to achieve their goals.

[Terry Fox Humanitarian Award](#): Involved in voluntary humanitarian activities.

[The Nurses Education Bursary](#): awarded each year to qualified nursing applicants who demonstrate the greatest financial need.

[Youth Futures Education Fund](#): Provides a grant to recipients of the Former Youth in Care Provincial Tuition Waiver, to assist with supplemental educational funding for expenses such as books, housing, utilities, or emergency situations.

[Youth educational assistance fund for former youth in care](#): This program provides grants of up to \$5,500 per program year to former B.C. youth in care students between 19 and 24 years of age. Students may receive a maximum of four grants.

BC's Apprentice and Trades Financial Support

[AIA and the UofAF Scholarship Program](#): A Canadian scholarship, which all students are encouraged to apply. However, priority will be given to those pursuing a career in the automotive aftermarket.

[B.C. Access Grant for Labour Market Priorities](#): Provides non-repayable funding to encourage students to attend targeted high-priority programs at public post-secondary institutions.

[B.C. Government and Service Employees Union Scholarships](#): Scholarships for post-secondary studies undertaken by BCGEU members, staff, and their families.

[Gardener Corner Scholarship](#): For those who have a strong passion for gardening, farming, raising livestock, green living, homesteading, agriculture, and permaculture.

[Holmes Foundation's Scholarships and Bursaries](#): Scholarships and Bursaries are for students in residential renovation or construction.

[Orvil L. Davie Memorial Fund](#): The purpose of the fund is to assist students in completing their education for a career in heating, ventilation, air conditioning, and refrigeration industry.

[TrustedPros Scholarships](#): TrustedPros awards two yearly scholarships to qualified applicants enrolled in a residential renovation or construction trade-related course of study.

[WorkBC](#): A 'one-stop-shop' where apprentices and their employees can learn all the financial supports available for them from Provincial and Federal sources.

[WHMIA Educational Foundation Scholarship](#): Scholarship for Woodworking Manufacturing students.
